What is a Linux[®] distribution?

"A Linux[®] distribution (often abbreviated to **distro**) is an **operating system** made from a software collection, which is based upon the Linux[®] kernel and often upon a package management system. Linux[®] users usually obtain their operating system by downloading one of the Linux[®] distributions which are available for a wide variety of systems ranging from embedded devices and personal computers to powerful supercomputers."
